Special Notices

SSL-VPN support

FortClient for iOS v2.0.1 GA only supports SSL-VPN web portal configuration. It does not support SSL-VPN tunnel mode configuration.

Client certificates

Client certificates for FortiClient for iOS v2.0.1 GA need to be in PKCS12 format, and have the extension p12.

Upgrade Information

FortiClient for iOS v2.0.1 GA supports direct upgrade from FortiClient for iOS v2.0.0 GA.

Bug ID	Description
170225	Does not support SSH, RDP, VNC, or Telnet bookmarks.
172999	FortiClient always reuses the previous, successful TLS session ID (and session) within 3 to 5 minutes.
